Presidents Report – Charlotte Konkle

Thank you all for coming today - seeing you all here lets me know that there is a future for the sport of tenpin bowling here in Ontario.

My special thanks go out to the following people:

- Wayne Dubs and his WECKBA group who have done an amazing job hosting and running the October 2014 seniors tournament and the 2015 OTBA adult tournament this past month you make it look so easy and you are a hard act to follow!
- Jayne Picott, Doug Imms, Murray Misener for this year's provincial youth tournament and the Joyce Woolgar Family Twosome
- Kathy Rideout and Chris Woolcock with the Ontario Youth singles tournament and the Ivan Nelson tournament
- all of the committee chairpersons and the members of their committees
- Last but certainly not least the Board of Directors they are special people.

Every local association has the right and the responsibility of having representation on the OTBA Board of Directors and even more depending on their association numbers of the previous year - there are 4 associations in Ontario who have not taken advantage of this and all that we can do is contact them and make them aware of the services that they are missing out on through our website - www.otba.ca - and hopefully in the near future our Facebook page.

The OTBA Hall of Fame has some very special members - these people are the back bone of our present association and without them all we would not be where we are today. They are all listed on the large display case at the back of the room. Hall of Fame bylaws and nomination forms are also on the website.

On this past weekend of May 28 - 31, 2015, the CTF Youth Championships were held in Winnipeg MB - the results are on the CTF website and both the Southern Ontario and Northern Ontario teams did well. These bowlers are the future of our sport so we need to support them. To that end, OTBA has taken \$12,000 from the OTBA youth Scholarship Fund and added it to the scholarship funds of the OTBA youth tournament, Ivan Nelson Memorial tournament, the Joyce Woolgar Memorial Family Twosome, the Ontario Youth Singles tournament and the OTBA annual high average awards. This is OTBA's contribution to the future of our youth stars.

Presidents Report Con't – Charlotte Konkle

The matter of amalgamation of the 3 bowling associations (Ontario 5 pin, Bowl Ontario and OTBA has been resurrected due to the fact that the Ministry of Sport has appointed a new consultant. While she isn't a bowler she is aware of the need for an "umbrella" organization of the 3 to deal with Sport Ontario funding which in the past OTBA has received no money from. There have been 2 meetings since last year and another one is scheduled for July 6. The stumbling block now is that BowlOntario has split into 2 groups - BowlOntario 5pin and BowlOntario 10pin and so the numbers allotted to each association for the formation of the Board of the "Bowling Federation of Ontario" are being discussed. So we go forward, all of us, with the best of intentions! I have to add that I have been invited to attend Bowl Ontario's AGM for the past 3 years but all 3 times I have been unable to attend.

You all know that the PanAm games are coming to Toronto in 2015 - the bowling venue is Planet Bowl in Toronto where the bowling will be held July 22 to 26. Erin and Brian McMaster are the co-chairs of the Sport Organizing Committee and I am proud to be a member of that committee. Last week we went and picked up our credentials and uniforms and we are in the middle of our on-line training which consists of 4 modules - 2 of which I have completed and 2 more that are waiting for me back at home. We will be at the venue from July 17 to the 26th! Tickets are very scarce for bowling - none are available for the finals but you might be able to get some for the semifinals. Canada's representatives are Isabelle Rioux of Quebec, Robin Orlikowski of St.Catharines, Ontario, Dan MacLelland of Kitchener and Francois Lavois of Quebec. Check out the website at www.toronto201.org for all sorts of information.

I am reminding all associations that OTBA offers awards to its members - the recipients names are sent in by the league secretary to the association manager who then forwards them on to the OTBA association manager. As most of you know we have had a problem with the new calculators and we are looking to replace that award with something without batteries.

OTBA will pay 25% up to a maximum of \$25 for any person who wants to take the coaching or lane inspector course offered by CTF. Tyrel Rose is organizing coaching courses across the country and

OTBA is looking into the lane certification courses.

I had the privilege to representing Ontario at the CTF AM in November via Adobe Connect and you will have my report later on in this meeting. At the present time, Brian McMaster of Niagara and Jim Lester of Lambton County are the elected directors from Ontario and I was appointed as a director to fill the 3rd spot for Ontario - it has been a very interesting 6 months for me!

It has been my very great privilege to have been involved in OTBA as a director for 4 years and as president for 7 years - there have been many changes in the past year and more are coming in order for our sport of tenpins to survive.

Wayne Dubs thanked Charlotte for all she did "Hard Act to Follow" during the past year.

CTF Report – Charlotte Konkle

Again it was my pleasure to represent Ontario TBA at the CTF Annual Meeting being held on November 15, 2014 via Adobe Connect. This meeting was the first to be held in November because of the changes implemented by CTF to comply with the Federal Non-Profit Act. Because there had been a meeting in April to finalize all changes to the CTF By-laws, CTF felt that they would hold this meeting via Adobe Connect so that the local and provincial associations would not have the extra costs of sending delegates to 2 meetings in 1 year.

All the registered delegates were given instructions on how to join the meeting, how to participate verbally and lastly how to vote. Amazing program!

The meeting was opened at 11:00 am (EST) by the President, Brian Von Richter of Saskatchewan. After the National Anthem, the Roll Call of the Board of Directors and the 1st vote allocation (28 delegates, 7 directors - majority 18) Brian VR welcomed everyone and introduced the Directors, the Delegates and guests.

Dan Tereck of Manitoba read the Rules of the Annual Meeting which were accepted as presented.

The minutes of the April 2014 Annual meeting were presented by Brian Von Richter and accepted by those present.

CTF Report Con't – Charlotte Konkle

The President, Brian Von Richter, presented his report. This was accepted as presented.

Stan May, the Executive Director, presented his report:

Dan Tereck, Regulatory Unit Chair presented his report. This committee is responsible for playing rules, bylaws and policy decisions for CTF. Dan also stated that his term as director comes to an end on Dec. 31 and decided not to run again. His report was accepted by the delegates.

Cathy Innes, High Performance Chair, gave a verbal report.

Highlights: - CTF has received funding from Sport Canada

- Reminder that Hilton Hotels is the Official Hotel Supplier of CTF and registered participants can receive 15% off for booking with them.

The report was accepted by the voting delegates.

CTF Report Con't – Charlotte Konkle

Felicia Wong, Athlete's Council Chair, presented her verbal report. She is helping Cathy Innes with the Team Canada athletes. Report accepted by delegates.

Brian McMaster, PanAm committee co-chair, presented the report. Welcome to Toronto2015 and members of the committee. Extensive training is being done by everyone involved. The report was accepted by the voting delegates.

Ron Molinski, Membership Services Chair presented a verbal report. Ron reminded everyone that any nominations for the Hall of Fame, Bowler of the Year and the Hazel McLeary award are to be sent to National Office. His report was accepted.

Blaine Boyle presented the Coach Development Report. Tyrel Rose is the Canadian Coach and is responsible for setting up coaching clinics across Canada. He has run 30 clinics so far and it was noted that there was a clinic run in Windsor a month ago. He is setting up more clinics all over Canada. The Coach Development report was accepted as presented.

Program Development - no report

Jim Lester, Youth Unit Chair, presented the report.

- Highlights: the first winners of the CTF Youth Scholarship award were Mykaela Mitchell of Ontario and Mitch Hupe from Manitoba - they each received \$1,000.
 - 2015 CYCs will be held in Winnipeg, MB the end of May
 - Thanks to his committee for their work

The report was accepted as presented.

The Awards Unit report was presented. The awards were outlined in the Acts of the Board with the addition of dates and years added to the plaques. The delegates accepted the report as presented.

CTF Connection is done by Dan Tereck and Sandy Lowe and they are looking for ideas/articles for the newsletter from everyone.

Dan Tereck, Nominating Committee Chair, presented the report and elections followed. Vote allocation - 28 delegates, 7 directors - total of 35 - majority is 18. Deborah Hope has decided not to run. Three directors were elected by majority - Dave Kist - Calgary, AB; Blaine Boyle - Estevan SK and Jim Lester - Sarnia ON. Their 3-year term commences Jan. 1, 2015.

Old Business - none

New Business - discussion regarding the 2015 CMC to be held in Calgary in November.
